

BYOD Guidelines

The School District of Webster is committed to 21st century learning, using 21st century tools. Students and staff may now use their own personal devices (laptops, netbooks, tablets, smart phones, etc) to access the Internet before, during, and after school. Students may now utilize the tools that they are comfortable with to take control of their own education. The opportunities for learning are limitless, borderless, and instantaneous.

Guidelines

The use of the device during the school days is at the discretion of the staff. The primary use is of an educational nature.

Webster School District is not responsible if the device is lost, stolen, or damaged. The school is also not responsible for the cost of any additional data usage that may occur.

The device may only access the internet using the school's wireless network. They may NOT use a 3G/4G data plan.

The student/staff is responsible for the operation of the device. The Webster School District is not allocating district resources for troubleshooting purposes.

The student/staff will be held accountable to the district responsible use policy, which governs conduct on the internet, while using their personal device.

Wireless access is for internet usage only. The school's internal network, which includes folders and printers, are not available.

Of note: The Webster School District has 2 wireless, guest networks. The first one is Tiger-Wireless. It is available during the school day and is intended for staff and students who are part of the Webster schools. It will provide layered access to the Internet, which allows older students and staff more access than a true guest network. The second network is called Webster-Guest. It will be available outside of normal school hours and requires no login of any kind. It is filtered at the lowest level.
